	 Submission of monthly expenditure reports required in terms of section 40(4)(c) of the Public Finance Management Act to the Provincial Treasury. Reported information should cover the full infrastructure budget in the department, not only these allocations.
	 Submission of a performance report on infrastructure spending 30 days after year end in the format determined by National Treasury (refer to Division of Revenue Bill 2013, (Bill nr. 1 of 2013) section 11(4)(a) and (b)).

- For RISFSA Class R1, R2 and R3 data collection requirements are:
 - ✓ visual condition data not older than two years for pavements and five years for bridges
 - ✓ instrumental pavement data for roughness, rut depth and macro texture not older than
 two years
 - ✓ instrumental pavement data for structural strength not older than five years
 - ✓ traffic data not older than three years
- For RISFSA Class R4 and R5 data requirements are:
